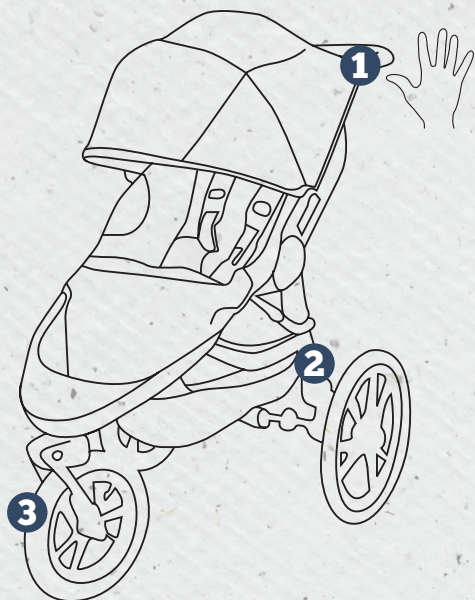


# Buggy Guide

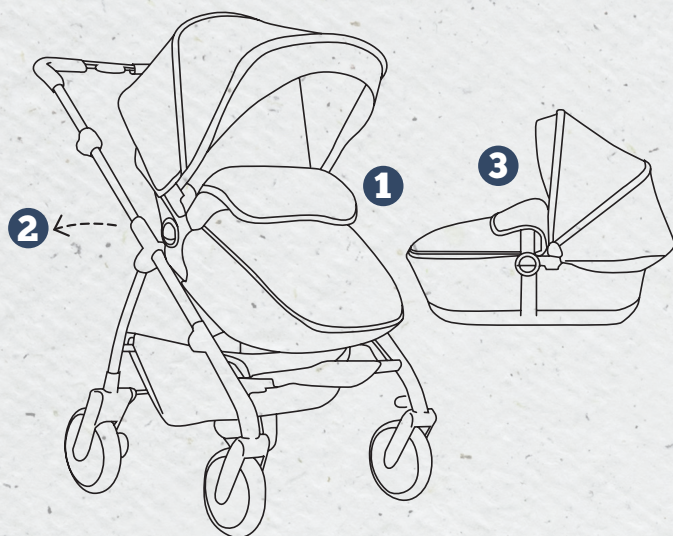


## Three wheel buggy

### ★ **Lightweight and manoeuvrable**

- 1 Easy to steer with one hand
- 2 Suspension on pneumatic tyre models for rough terrain!
- 3 Foam filled tyres for city use

### ★ **Car seat/carrycot/ attachments available**

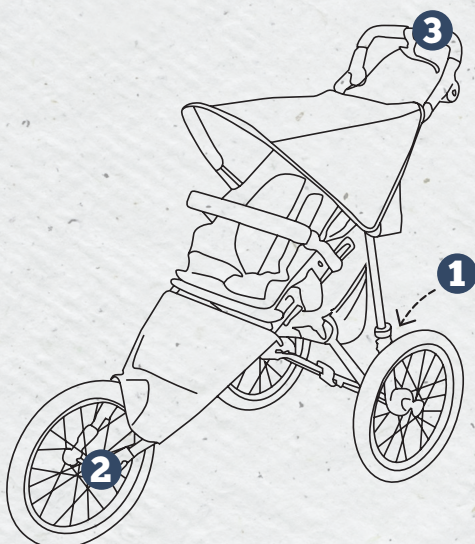


## Three in one buggy

- 1 Can be used as an upright buggy or lie flat like a pram
- 2 Some give you the option of having your child facing you (which is a bonus in the first few months)
- 3 Can also come with a separate detachable carrycot

### ★ **Contemporary traditional styling**

### ★ **Many have footmuffs and rain covers as accessories**



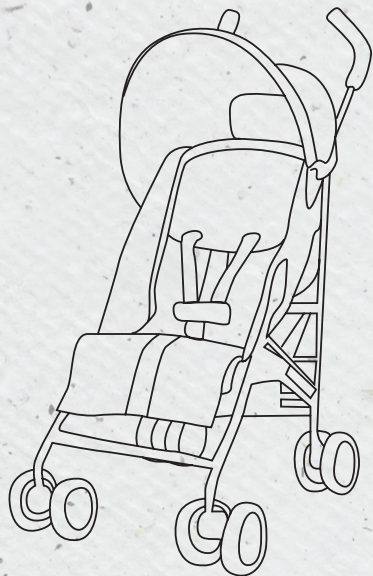
## Sports buggy

- 1 Similar to the forward facing buggy but with suspension system designed to allow you to go running with your baby
- 2 Lightweight with fixed front wheel and larger than normal wheels
- 3 Handlebar-mounted brake lever to control speed

! **It is unsafe to run with baby in buggy until baby is at least 6 months old**

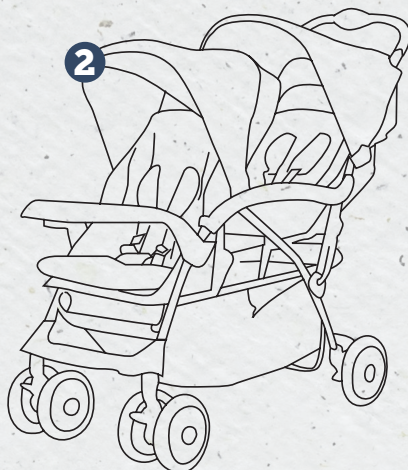


# Buggy Guide



## The stroller

- ★ **Lightweight and robust and ideal for travel or short trip around shops**
- ! **Not always suitable from birth, but some do semi recline - more suited to older babies from 6 months+**
- ✗ Small shopping baskets and lack of comfort
- ✗ Poorer suspension and padding compared to a buggy



## Double or tandem

- ★ **Suitable for families with more than one child**

- 1 Double buggies are suitable for children of similar age, where the children sit side-by-side

\*Some can accommodate two carrycots, or one carrycot and main seat, or infant car seat and main seat

- 2 Tandem strollers usually have one fully reclining seat suitable for newborns, whilst the other seat would be forward facing suitable for toddlers
