
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#### Rear-facing only Okg to 13kg+ Birth to 6/12/15 months

This is typically the first seat a newborn will use, they only rear face and depending on the type you buy can cater for babies from 1.8kg to 13kg+ or birth to 6 - 10 months (some go to 15.8kg which can be up to a 15 month old!)





#### Rear and forward facing Okg to 18kg - birth to 4 years Okg to 29kg - birth to 5/6 years

Best NZ practice rear-facing to age 2 years or longer

This type of seat will rear face often from birth and when converted to forward facing mode up to four years of age. The length of time you can rear face for will depend on the seat you buy.





Rear and forward facing Plus a booster seat **Okg to 45kg+/54kg** 



## Birth to 6/7/8 years

Best NZ practice rear-facing to age 2 years or longer

These seats can go from birth to booster, often you may still need to buy a booster seat for older children if you pass your seat on to your next child.

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# Harnessed Booster (3N1 or 2N1)

#### Forward-facing only with and without harness

#### 9kg to 36kg+ 9 months to 8+ years

#### **Best NZ practice from age 2+ years**

Sometimes called 3n1 seats, these harness from 9kg to 18kg or up to 30kg depending on the seat you buy. Converts to an unharnessed booster as well, some become half boosters.









## 315-18kg to 36kg+ 4 years to 8+ years

Full back booster with no harness, children need to be at least 15-18kg to use these in conjunction with the vehicle seat belt. Some become half boosters.
